Statewide E-911 Fund 1222

Discussion: This budget has an increase of \$16, 701. The increase is items that were approved throughout the year. The budget shows a tiered salary system. This is based on mastering a skill set. The Hourly item is not going to be used. The budget is to staff 42. Right now they have 28 and five in training. This is a fee based fund. It was suggested to reduce the Hourly to \$25,000.

E-911 (FB Fund 4922)

Discussion: This is part of the Foundation budget. It will be discussed later.

EMA (GF)

Discussion: This budget is up some. They would like to buy uniforms for the volunteers who put in over 1,000 hours per year. The EMA Directors have been taking an active role in responding to the scene. They would like to purchase them a ballistic vest.

Motion: Dan Whitten moved to approve. Sylvia Graham seconded the motion. Motion approved by unanimous voice vote.

Discussion: Training and Education consists of certifications that are required. Volunteers are required to go to training. There are 17 volunteers. He is spending money on siren parts and to have two complete sirens on hand should one go down.

LEPC Emergency Plan 1152 EMA Hazardous Substance 1221 EMA – Dist 1 Task Force Fund 4020 EMA SHSP Sub Grant 8146

Motion: Dan Whitten moved to approve LEPC Emergency Plan 1152, EMA Hazardous Substance 1221, EMA – Dist 1 Task Force Fund 4020, EMA SHSP Sub Grant 8146. Mike Jessen seconded the motion. Motion approved by unanimous voice vote.

This grant is for the five county region. The other counties pitch in. There is a MOU in place. The money in there now is reimbursement from hurricane Sandy.

Surveyor (GF)

Surveyor Perpetuation 1202

Discussion: Fees are higher so Surveyors are seeing more than they have in the past. This has allowed him to come to the Council and request new vehicles. He also has hired part time help in the summer.

Parks (GF)

Discussion: The increase is capital items. It is in the Master Plan adopted two years ago. It was suggested that Capital Projects would be better addressed when the budget process has been gone through. The Park Board has requested that the budget focus more on maintenance and repair than program delivery. It was discussed what the budget would be with Capital Projects removed.

Motion: Dan Whitten moved to approve \$519,348. Jeff Larson seconded the motion. Motion approved by unanimous voice vote.

Parks Operating 1179

Discussion: This budget has a decrease.

Motion: Dan Whitten moved to approve. Sylvia Graham seconded the motion. Motion approved by unanimous voice vote.

Discussion: The hourly is up. They did not fund a communications director so took it out of the GF and put part time help in non-reverting fund. He has changed some to where fees support the activity. Advertising is down. They are moving away from direct mail. They are investing more on the digital side. There has been no detrimental effect from not doing the direct mailings.

Recycling & Waste District Management

Discussion: At the end of August the General Fund was at \$1.6 Million. They are asking to be able to increase hourly so they can open a compost site for Portage and more hours in Boone Grove. They are also asking for an increase in contractual. The recycling costs could double.
