Com. Good, Good Morning this is the Porter County Board of Commissioners' meeting Tuesday, March 16th, 2021.

Com. Blaney, moved to approve the Consent Agenda, Com. Biggs, second, motion carried.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

The Appointment of Terry Wuletich to the Porter County Board of Health due to the resignation of Elizabeth Forbes. Ms. Forbes has relocated outside of Porter County.

Atty. Hollenbeck, Terry has graciously indicated a willingness to come on board. We're really excited about that and she brings all sorts of expertise in the medical area. She is a long-time resident of Porter County. Terry tell them a little bit of how long you've worked in Porter County and what you did.

Ms. Wuletich, I've been in Porter County most of my life. I grew up in Portage. I went to Purdue Calumet for my nursing degree. Then I began my career of being a nurse at Porter Hospital. I've been in the emergency department. I've been on the district task forces. Dedicated my entire career to service the community.

Com. Good, Thank you.

Atty. Hollenbeck, This will be an interim appointment until the end of the term that she's filling which will be at the end of this calendar year. Then we will have to fill that again. With me as well is our chairman Martin.

Com. Blaney, moved to approve the appointment of Terry Wuletich, Com. Biggs, second, motion carried.

Com. Good, Thank you and welcome aboard.

NEW BUSINESS

A Proposal with Schmidt Associates for the Preparation of an ALTA/NSPS Land Title Survey & Topographic Survey for the Memorial Opera House.

Com. Good, This is just a survey that we will be taking of the grounds and area of the Memorial Opera House.

Com. Blaney, moved to approve the proposal for Schmidt Associates, Com. Biggs, second, motion carried.

COMMISSIONERS

The Appointment of Kurt Stefans to Fill a Vacancy on the Board of Directors of the Damon Run Conservancy District.

Atty. Ferngren, The district board is supposed to consist of 5 members but we only have 4 at this time. Mr. Stefans thankfully volunteered to fill the final seat. His will be an interim board position until our meeting in February. By Indiana Law the Board of Commissioners have the authority to approve the appointment.

Com. Biggs, Does Kurt live in the district?

Atty. Ferngren, Yes he does.

Com. Blaney, moved to approve the appointment of Kurt Stefans, Com. Biggs, second, motion carried.

An Ordinance Establishing a Fund for Deposit of Proceeds from a Soil and Water Conservation Grant to the Porter County Park Department – 1st Reading.

Atty. Hollenbeck, As you have done in the past when the Parks Dept. through Walter's effort secures a grant pursuant to the State Board of Accounts requirements and our Auditor's concurrence in that. We have to keep this money separate the grant money and we do that by asking you to create an ordinance that creates the fund into which this money will go. Walter why don't you tell them quickly what the money is for.

Mr. Lenckos, This is funding for restoration at Hawk Ridge County Park in Pine Township, restoring about 20 acres of former agricultural fields.

Com. Biggs, Just to be clear for the audience the money is still managed by the County Council when you get to the point you have to appropriate (Inaudible).

Atty. Hollenbeck, You are creating the depository into which the money will go. For the money to come out it does take the County Council. I did prepare a proposed ordinance format that we've used for other ones like these.

Com. Good, The 2nd Reading will be on April 6th.

PrecisionPoint – 3D Scanning for Memorial Opera House in the amount of \$5,190.00.

Com. Good, What we are going to be doing is a 3 D scanning. They will go inside the building and they will be able to get precise measurements. Usually in historical buildings you aren't able to take measurements. This is a new way of going in to assess what you have inside of the building. We feel that this is something that needs to be done in order start moving towards the possible renovation of the project. We are in the phases of gathering information and data. That is what we are moving towards today?

Com. Biggs, I am familiar with that scanning, it is pretty cool. It is really developed for a particular situation or a building like the Memorial Opera House which has so many nooks and crannies it is almost impossible to measure by hand.

Com. Blaney, moved to approve PrecisionPoint, Com. Biggs, second, motion carried.

Com. Good, Just to let you know there were 2 quotes that we received. The one was from Nederveld at \$5600.00 and PrecisionPoint was \$5,190.00 so they are the low quote.

Ms. Dykes, I brought Christy with me. She is one of my deputies and she will be attending all of these meetings representing the Coroner’s Office so I will let her explain.

Ms. Chervenak, The Indiana State Dept. of Health reached out to the Coroner’s Office during a meeting I was in and asked if I would be willing to participate in the Opioid Fatality Review Team where they are reviewing our cases throughout the year. They are reviewing what our gaps are in our community. HealthLinc, Porter Starke and other community organizations are included in on the meetings as well. With that there is a payment to our office for participating in this by HealthLinc.

Com. Blaney, moved to approve the MOU with HealthLinc, Com. Biggs, second, motion carried.

Mr. Serrano, There is a new garage on 700 N. and they need internet service so that we can give them connectivity back to us our facilities.

MEMORIAL OPERA HOUSE – SCOT MACDONALD, DIRECTOR

Boyce Systems – A Maintenance Agreement providing Support Services for the Accounting System in the amount of \$1,000.00. The term shall begin May 1, 2021 and end April 30, 2022.

Mr. MacDonald, This is our accounting software Boyce that we enter everything that we put into LOW so it is public record. It is a yearly agreement to pay for software.

Com. Blaney, moved to approve Boyce Systems, Com. Biggs, second, motion carried.

EXPO CENTER – LORI DALY, DIRECTOR

A Memorandum of Understanding between the Porter County Board of Commissioners and the Porter County Agricultural Society regarding the LED Billboard at the Porter County Expo Center/Fairgrounds.

Ms. Daly, What we have here is an MOU with the Ag Society. The digital sign on 49 is broke it says January 1st and I can't control it. We have no control of it at all. In a conversation with David. He went out very nicely on his own and got 4 bids to update the sign. It is mainly the digital portion so the guts will stay. We will paint the holes. The MOU is with them we will split it 50/50, which we paid \$80,000.00 for it in 2007 I do believe and we will just reimburse them for half and the MOU states what we would pay them every quarter.

Com. Good, This will be a bigger sign correct?

Ms. Daly, It is, instead of 3 by 9 ½ it will be 4 by 9 ½ the actual digital part of it. We'll still leave those 4 spaces for advertising which we rent out. The pixels went from 19 to (Inaudible).....

Com. Good, That's what will make it seem so much bigger than what it was just because of the mega pixels.

Com. Biggs, Will it stand any taller?

Ms. Daly, It will not. I spoke to Bob. He knows all about it. I need to go get my permit. He didn't seem to have an issue with it, we will see once I do the permit. It was very nice of them.

Com. Good, I think it's awesome. I think what that is going to create on that corner is going to be very visually appealing. I'm excited.

Com. Biggs, We have to have it.

Ms. Daly, The radios on the actual sign itself are outdated and I can't get new parts so we had to do something so this is what we came up with.

Com. Good, I think it's timely and appropriate.

Com. Blaney, Good partnership.

Com. Blaney, moved to approve the MOU, Com. Biggs, second, motion carried.

Boyce Systems – A Maintenance Agreement providing Support Services for the Accounting System in the amount of \$2,140.00. The term shall begin May 1, 2021 and end April 30, 2022.

Ms. Daly, Mine is a little more expensive because we have more users.

Com. Blaney, moved to approve Boyce Systems, Com. Biggs, second, motion carried.

FACILITIES – RAY CLOYD, DIRECTOR

Sounds Cool Live Audio, LLC – An Estimate for a new Sound System in the Commissioners’ Chambers in the amount of \$14,853.92.

Mr. Cloyd, I am proposing a new sound system for the Commissioners’ Chambers. New technology and we would be able to do live feed, expand our camera system if we need to if we have another Corona Virus outbreak and also space you out.

Com. Good, Basically we’re updating everything in here and it will also allow us to screen and do other things that we weren’t able to do because we were limited technology wise. It is timely and the right thing to do.

Com. Biggs, (Inaudible). We came in here in 93 it is time.

Mr. Cloyd, We need to keep up with technology.

Com. Good, We should have a higher quality of picture. A higher quality audio, which I know is one of the things that I’ve been concerned about. The audio is pretty spotty sometimes.

Com. Blaney, It is hit or miss. You never know.

Com. Good, We’re just trying to strengthen all of that. You were involved with Stretch from MOH. We got the guru’s on it.

Com. Blaney, moved to approve Sounds Cool Live Audio, LLC, Com. Biggs, second, motion carried.

Mr. Cloyd, We’re proposing a 4 year contract.

Com. Good, So we finally got them all under 1 contract. I know it took a while and it’s a lot of work. Good news.

Com. Blaney, moved to approve LionHeart, Com. Biggs, second, motion carried.

HIGHWAY DEPT. – RICH SEXTON, SUPERINTENDENT

A Request for an Additional Appropriation Fund #1176 in the amount of \$35,000.00 to Acct. #1130 Overtime. To cover the additional work from the snowfall received over the last two months which occurred mainly on the weekends. The average cost in just overtime for one weekend was around \$13,000.00.

Com. Good, The cost of the overtime will give you an idea of what we’re up against on a daily basis for overtime.

Com. Biggs, I received and I assume the other 2 Commissioners have as well a lot of compliments from residence how well you guys did during that time.

Mr. Sexton, They did a really great job considering the amount of snow we got as fast as we got it.

Com. Biggs, We appreciate it.

Com Blaney, And it's always on weekends.

Com. Good, No rest for 48 hours.

Mr. Sexton, Called me on Friday at 6 and she said are you guys ready? Let's go.

Com. Good, And 4 days later we got none.

Com. Blaney, moved to approve the Additional Appropriation, Com. Biggs, second, motion carried.

Com. Good, I would also like to say I think us sitting down and talking about the Frost Law and how we took a different direction this year compared to what we normally do, I think it worked out very well.

Com. Blaney, I received a lot of compliments.

Com. Biggs, So did I.

Mr. Sexton, It worked out really well for us and looking forward to next year actually for once with Frost Law. (Inaudible) Thank you for your help on that as well.

Com. Good, Thanks Rich.

DEVELOPMENT & STORM WATER MNGMNT. – BOB THOMPSON, DIRECTOR

Award Bids for the 2020-2 CCMG Program for paving work to be done on the following roads:

- **Meridian Rd. – from 900 N to 1050 N**
- **550 South – from Sloan St. to 250 W**
- **Smoke Rd. – from SR 2 to Division Rd.**
- **Baums Bridge Rd. – from SR 8 to 900 S**
- **700 North – from 400 W to 500 W**
- **Tower Rd. (250 West) – from SR 130 to 500 N**

Com. Good, We opened the bids at the last meeting and now we are going to award. What was the staff's recommendation?

Mr. Thompson, The staff's recommendation is to award Rieth Riley Construction the contract for \$884,136.72. I do want to point out at the last meeting you did read off their sealed bid at \$883,905.72. Matt and Chris found about a \$200.00 error and corrected but it is still the lowest bid.

Com. Biggs, That is a lot of blacktop. It's going to make a big difference.

Mr. Thompson, It is.

Com. Biggs, moved to approve the Rieth Riley Construction contract, Com. Blaney, second, motion carried.

An Ordinance for the Zona Park Property Rezone – 950 North between 550 East and LaPorte County Line Rd. - Zoning Map Amendment RR, Rural Residential District to P1, Parks and Recreation District. Petitioner Porter County Parks – 2nd Reading.

Com. Biggs, moved to approve the Rezone on 2nd Reading, Com. Blaney, second, motion carried.

An Ordinance to Rezone the Southwest corner of U.S. Hwy. 30 and 150 West - Zoning Map Amendment R1, Low Density Single-family Residential District to CM, Moderate Intensity Commercial District. Petitioner Frank Marshall – 2nd Reading.

Com. Blaney, moved to approve the Rezone on 2nd Reading, Com. Biggs, second, motion carried.

An Ordinance to Rezone the Southwest corner of U.S. Hwy. 30 and Moorland Dr. – Zoning Map Amendment R1, Low Density Single-family Residential District to CM, Moderate Intensity Commercial District. Petitioner Hayes Leonard – 2nd Reading.

Com. Blaney, moved to approve the Rezone on 2nd Reading, Com. Biggs, second, motion carried.

An Amendment to a License Agreement between NIPSCO and the Porter County Board of Commissioners for Jogging, Hiking and Bicycle Trail.

Mr. Thompson, We were here a few months ago for the amendment where we were actually moving the trail north into the SR 49 Bridge. They were going to take down the slope wall and put up a barring wall and then run the trail behind a pier. NIPSCO utilities kind of stopped that thought so now what they are going to do is keep the trail in the original position that it is in and they will still pave it but what they will do is put a barrier wall between the trail and the double track and they are also putting a fence to separate the pedestrians from the double track project.

Com. Good, Bob is NIPSCO doing that or is NICTD doing that?

Mr. Thompson, NICTD is going to be doing the work. They are going to be paving that section underneath SR 49 and then redoing it to get into the train station because they are going to be moving the crossing that you see there closer to the platforms. They are going to be putting up the barrier wall, the fence, paving that area under 49 and then getting it to their new route into the train station.

Com. Biggs, Hikers and bikers can use the trail when all of this construction is going on?

Mr. Thompson, When that goes on I would say no. They're probably going to close the trail to get the wall and the fence.

Com. Good, It is a pretty tight area there.

Mr. Thompson, Yes. I don't know what NIPSCO is going to do during the double track project. I'm hoping they keep the trail open and I'm hoping that the existing trail does not become the construction road for the double track project.

Com. Biggs, We'll see. I'm sure they'll work it out.

Mr. Thompson, Normally in the past with platforms NIPSCO has not allowed them. We'll see.

Com. Biggs, I just noticed all of this blacktopping we're doing is along the bike trails and our County roads. They will have some place else they can go.

Com. Blaney, moved to approve the Amended License agreement with NIPSCO, Com. Biggs, second, motion carried.

Com. Good, I would like to add one thing. Probably in April we will be doing a presentation in our Chambers with the National Park Service regarding our new thoughts and ideas for the new Calumet Trail we have been working on for the past 6 to 7 months. Hopefully we will be doing a full presentation on what our plans are for the completion of that trail. Since the National Park has been designated as a National Park over the last year to year and a half we have been having meetings with the National Park Service and trying to reinvent a different way of going about the trail rather than just going down a NIPSCO easement. We think we have some really cool things to show you. Keep an eye on our agendas it will be one of the meetings in April.

Mr. Thompson, I have a date for the National Parks to be here on April 6th.

Com. Good, On April 6th our next meeting we will have a presentation with our Department and the National Park Service and we will show Porter County what we have been working on for our 9 Mile Trail. How it will interface with the Dunes Station and all of the different that go along with that. We're excited.

Com. Biggs, (Inaudible) the popularity of that trail and the suspected popularity of this particular project because it is really going to enhance if we move forward the way it is going to be planned out. Curt we will get everything on our site so people can't make to our meeting will be able to see it.

Mr. Thompson, We'll actually have a video too.

Com. Biggs, We can get all of that on there can't we?

Mr. Thompson, Yes, the video is a little long its GoPro.

Com. Good, We're excited. We have been working on this quietly and trying to work through using some existing funds that were already there, Federal Funds and we have that captured now. I think we have a great story to tell and I think the residents of the County are going to be really pleased.

Com. Blaney, It is part of bigger system.

Com. Good, Not too many times do you get to sit down and work with the National Park System and collaborate on a project. That is pretty cool. I also think because of the NICTD and all of the money and interest that is being shown to our North Lakeshore with our transportation items coming on I think it is all coming up to a nice peak. I think by the time in the next 2 to 3 years and all of this is done I think we're really going to have something that is going to catch a lot of people's attention. We're excited about that. Not only people from the outside but this is really for the people that live here as well. It is a 9 mile trail that will connect you into Michigan City and going west. It gives you a lot of connectivity to do a lot of different things. With the train and all of the improvements that are being done in Michigan City you can bike out to Michigan City or you can get on the train in Michigan City and take it back to Chicago. There is a lot of flexibility of what you can do. Looking forward to that at our next meeting.

USI Consultants – A Construction Engineering Agreement for Bridge 168 – Brummit Rd. over the Little Calumet River not to exceed \$218,000.00.

Mr. Thompson, The Bridge is set to be let by INDOT after the first of this year. We're just getting all of the agreements in place going forward on this. We're working on right-of-way so we're waiting for this bridge to go.

Com. Biggs, What do you project for the completion of this?

Mr. Thompson, With the January letting I'm assuming by the time they get through the awards for the contract the contract will probably get going in April. With this bridge it will probably be inconveniencing the school a little bit. The goal probably would be to hopefully have the bridge done before school starts.

Com. Blaney, That would be a big detour.

Mr. Thompson, Yes, especially since there are like 60 buses that cross that daily.

Com. Good, And this is a protected tributary?

Mr. Thompson, It is, the salmonids that will be of concern too. They're only allowed certain times in the stream, however there is some waiver process. We got one with Bridge 62 on the Kankakee. There are certain times when DNR will say absolutely now work in the stream.

Com. Biggs, Isn't the Town of Porter doing canoeing? Don't they have a parks program where they rent canoes out?

Mr. Thompson, Shirley Heinze has a kayak/canoe launch right there at that bridge.

Com. Biggs, Is that going to affect that at all?

Mr. Thompson, We're working with Shirley Heinze on that as far as the design of the guardrail and getting access to that. We've also made wider shoulders on that particular bridge. As a matter of fact on one side I think I had the guardrail going up higher because a lot of bikers go up on it. Your standard guardrail is not tall enough for a biker. They can hit and right over. We went up a little bit higher because it is a very popular biking route and we've also made much wider shoulders on this bridge.

Com. Biggs, That is really going to compliment that because it is right down the street from their park. There is a lot of pedestrian traffic that runs that and goes over that bridge in the summer especially.

Com. Good, I would like to point out too again this is a different approach in how we've approached our Bridge Program over the years. We just did one last fall with the Town of Porter where we did the same thing. They had trail and we built a trail on to the bridge. So as we go in and we start redoing these bridges depending on where they are at we're trying to go out and create a little more ground. We helped Porter get a sewer easement, a future easement for sewer if they ever wanted to run it through. We're really trying to be purposeful when we redo these bridges because there is either a trail component, or a utility component. Sometimes when you do them you have to get more ground, more right-of-way. It takes a little bit more time, effort and money. You get a 30/40 year bite at an apple you want to be able to do it right when you do it. It is all about looking forward and looking ahead. I know this bridge will do the same thing.

Com. Biggs, Compliments to your department and Scott as well with the negotiations with the Town of Porter to get that done. It is encouraging to see it on the list.

Com. Biggs, moved to approve USI Consultants, Com. Blaney, second, motion carried.

EXTRA MILE FITNESS COMPANY - ALI BROWN

A request to use County roads located in Jackson Township for Race the Region. A half marathon event to be held on Sunday, May 23rd, 2021 from 7:00 am to 9:00 am. The event will begin and end at Coffee Creek Watershed Preserve in Chesterton. They will be working with the Sheriff's Dept. to hire off duty officers based on safety recommendations. A map of the course has been included.

Ms. Brown, Good morning everyone. We are looking to hold a race a 5k and half marathon on Sunday morning, May the 23rd. The 5k will be completely enclosed in Coffee Creek so we are good with that. We are just looking for approval to use some of the roads in Jackson Township. Specifically we would be using 200, Tratebas and then a small section of 400, which would be a turnaround.

Com. Blaney, moved to approve the Race the Region, Com. Biggs, second, motion carried.

VALPARAISO EVENTS – MICHELLE MICHAELS

A request to use the Courthouse grounds for the Chocolate Walk on Saturday, May 1st, 2021 between 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. There will be no more than 20 stations setup to distribute chocolate.

Ms. Michaels, We usually do this inside the retail and restaurant locations in May but with some COVID precautions we need to have people collect their chocolate outside. We thought around the Courthouse we could have attendees go to different stations that would be spread out and collect their prepackaged chocolate. Then if they would like to go shop or dine downtown that day they can.

Com. Blaney, moved to approve the Chocolate Walk, Com. Biggs, second, motion carried.

Com. Biggs, I think this is going to be very popular.

Ms. Michaels, This ticket sells out in under 5 minutes.

Com. Good, Like the Wine Fest or the Brew Fest.

Ms. Michaels, It will be our first fund raiser in a year. Thank you.
